



IARU Ageing, Longevity and Health Graduate Student Conference (GSC)

Abstract Submission Guidelines

The GSC will be held concurrently with the Scientific Conference in the form of a Poster Conference. Candidates whose abstracts are selected for the poster presentation are eligible for application for partial scholarships of up to Singapore \$1000.00.

Key Dates:

- **16 July 2018:** Abstract submission closing date
- **6 August 2018:** Notification to authors of shortlisted abstracts

The Committee will review all abstracts and author(s) of shortlisted abstracts will be notified.

Guidelines for Abstract Submission:

- Abstracts should be submitted before the submission deadline: **16 July 2018**.
- Abstracts must be submitted electronically in English by the appropriate deadlines.
- Abstracts' title should be concise and indicative of the content of the abstract.
- Abstracts should be no more than 300 words in length.
- Details of authors should be given in accordance to descending order of contribution (from most to least).
- The presenting author must be indicated in the abstract submission form.
- Each author is allowed to submit no more than **TWO** abstracts.
- The use of standard abbreviations is acceptable. Place special or unusual abbreviations in brackets after the full word the first time it appears. Use numerals to indicate numbers, except to begin sentences.
- The use of tables, graphs and other types of images in abstracts is not permitted.
- Abstracts will be reproduced exactly as submitted.
- Please do not submit multiple copies of the same abstract.
- Abstracts not adhering to the above will not be considered.



Content:

Please be sure your abstract contains the following prior to submission:

- An abstract must consist of a **title, author list** and the **abstract text**.
- Abstracts must be properly formatted and organised into four sections identified by the following bolded headers: **Aims, Methodology, Results** and **Conclusion**.
 - Aims: indicate the objective of the research, the hypothesis that was tested or a description of the problem being analysed or evaluated.
 - Methodology: describe the study period / setting / location, study design, study population, data collection and methods of analysis used.
