Elementary Enrollment of Children with Special Needs (CWSN) in India: Evidence from U_DISE (2009-10 to 2015-16)



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Introduction:

- Nowadays, education of children with special needs (CWSN) consider as a development issue at national as well as international debates, and it also included in the sustainable development goals (UN 2015).
- ➤ Research evidence shows that disabled people have lower educational level than their non-disabled groups of population (2008; WHO/World Bank, 2011; World Bank, 2007, Census of India,2011, U_DISE-2015-16)...
- The government of India enacted many laws, act, policies that promote the education of children with special needs in both mainstream and special schools. The right of the person with a disability, 1995, the national trust act, 1999, DPEP(1994), SSA(2007), Janshala Programme, the right to education act all these acts and policies implemented after 1990.

 Findings: The proportional enrollment among CWSN is around 1.16% which indicate very low compared to their counterpart age group (6-14 years). In this study, it has found that there are inconsistencies and deficiencies in the enrollment data of CWSN children due to screening out CWSN children by the school authority.

Aim of Study:

This study examines the status of elementary proportional enrollment among CWSN at the state-level in India.

Method and Data of Study:

- ➤ U_DISE, Unified district information for the education system from 2009-10 to 2015-16
- The Geo-spatial technique is used to understand the variance in the enrollment of CWSN in a different region in the country.

Results:

Enrollment of CWSN children:






Map 1: Proportional Enrollment of CWSN Children to Total Enrollment at Elementary Level in India(6-14 year Age Group).

Conclusion:

- ➤ it has been found that there has been a clear variation in the enrollment data of CWSN children between north and south Indian states. Variations in the enrollment of CWSN between north and south Indian states may be institutional structure set up, furthermore, According to World Bank (2007), 80% of disabled household in the Uttar-Pradesh were not aware of the certification of disability during the field visit.
- ➤ It has been found that there is no significant association between enrollment of CWSN children with aid and appliances services, teacher related and schools facilities indicators.
- There is inconsistency and deficiencies in the enrollment data of CWSN children in U_DISE data due to screening out of CWSN children.

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
