Dear APA members,

The 5th APA Council (2019-2021) has been working during an unusual time – the COVID-19 pandemic era. The pandemic posed challenges to our functioning and the many events and activities that we had planned for this term. I am glad to report that despite the challenges we were able to carry on the work of the association and hold several events.

The last APA in-person meeting was 4-6 March 2020 in Bangkok. After that we moved to virtual meetings. The pandemic provided an opportunity to adopt to online communication and virtual technologies. This allowed us to engage and communicate for more frequently (and at no additional cost) with APA council officers, members, as well as our partners and collaborators.

The 5th APA international conference was scheduled to be conducted in Yogyakarta, Indonesia, on 24-27 November 2020, with National Population and Family Planning Board (BKKBN), Indonesia and Center for Population and Policy Studies, Universitas Gadjah Mada, Indonesia as the local hosts. With the pandemic, the conference was postponed and was conducted as our first ever virtual conference on 3-5 August 2021. The conference was attended by 760 international participants from 37 countries. It was the largest number of participants APA has had.

We planned for an inclusive conference and reduced our registration fees to just \$25. This allowed a large number of people to attend the conference. Participants did not have to seek funding for travelling, including accommodation and visa. Participants did not have to apply leave to attend the conference. The low cost to participate has also allowed young and retired scholars to benefit and contribute to the conference.

APA also conducted many other activities during the 2019-2021. One of them is a colloquium on innovations in teaching and research in demography in Asia, held right before the General Assembly, on 10 November 2021. The colloquium provided a new beginning of more collaborations on training and research among institutions concerned with population issues in Asia. It discussed, among other things, how studies on demography can continue being relevant to development issues in Asia. It examined how demographic training and research can respond to current and future triple disruptions: pandemic/endemic, digital technology, and climate crisis. It is hoped that the next, 6th Council will follow up this new beginning.

In this occasion, I would like to thank all parties and individuals who have contributed to the work of the current council. A special gratitude is to UNFPRO for their continued financial support and partnership on many of the APA activities.

I also deeply appreciate the contribution of the local host (Indonesia) of the 5th APA conference – National Population and Family Planning Board (BKKBN), Republic of Indonesia; Center for Population and Policy Studies, Universitas Gadjah Mada, Indonesia; and Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy, Republic of Indonesia.

My special thanks to APA Council officers and members who have provided continuous strong support to all APA activities. The work of the Secretariat, under Rossarin Gray and later Aree Jampaklay, has been superb. I owe a lot to them.

Finally, I am looking forward to your continuous support to and participation in APA activities.



The 5th APA Conference 2021



The 5th Asian Population Association Conference was held successfully as the first ever online conference of APA during 3-5 August, 2021, co-hosted by APA, BKKBN, and CPPS-UGM. It was planned for the period of 24-27 November 2020 in Yogyakarta, Indonesia. Given the COVID-19 pandemic situation, the APA held it online, having the total of 760 participants from 37 countries in Asia as well as across the world.

We received 1,788 abstracts in response to our call for papers. Theme 3 on fertility, fecundity, reproductive health and reproductive rights received the most number of submissions, followed by theme 4 on mortality, morbidity, epidemiology and causes of death. APA scientific committee reviewed the abstract with assistance from reviewers. We would like to thank all the reviewers, moderators, chair, and presenters for their contribution to the success of the conference.



The registration for the conference was also processed through an online system. In addition, APA has provided full and partial scholarships for outstanding participants from low-income countries who could not attend the conference due to financial hardship.

The conference brought together scholars, researchers, policymakers, and government officials to discuss Asian population issues and related fields among its participants. There were 106 parallel live presentations and 165 pre-recorded or poster presentations to discuss on and contribute to various population issues. The conference has provided a successful case of dealing with obstacles under the COVID-19 pandemic.

New APA Website – Becoming More Accessible and Multisystem



We are transforming the APA website to be more accessible by, integrating multiple systems together. The new website uses the same platform of various systems consisting of website, membership database, mass mailing, and polling systems. It facilitates APA members to log into the membership database and receive information through the website using a single access point.

The website is continuously updated with APA activities and announcements for our members to follow up on the current activities. A section of call for abstracts, papers, and proposals, and the submission channels on the specific themes is being updated monthly to encourage APA members to disseminate and publish their research in demography and related fields. Additionally, many of the regional population associations are also listed on the website for the APA members information.





The panelists discussed the prominent role that financial security plays in the wellbeing of older adults, including how the Covid-19 pandemic has amplified existing inequalities among older adults.

APA Scientific Activities
