Background

Asia is the world's largest and most populous continent. With almost four and a half billion people, it is home to more than 60% of the world's current population. Asia is also the center of some of the fastest sustained economic growth rates in the world as well as some of the most intractable problems of poverty. Asia is both diverse and dynamic in terms of population growth trends.

There are many emerging population issues having significant impacts on the future of the world's population as they pose major challenges to communities and local governments across the region. There is a great need for scientific studies of population which can be translated into policy actions in countries with diverse socio-demographic settings.

Asian Population Association (APA) was established in 2007 in an effort to provide a broad forum for Asian scholars, promote greater awareness of the diversity of research across the region, and build new collaborations and ties. APA aims to foster research, enhance collaboration, and safeguard and upgrade key data collection efforts.

What we do

- Organizing regional and specialized conferences

- Coordinating the work of Scientific Committees and Working Groups and document research output
- Cooperation with related professional organizations such as the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population (IUSSP) and regional population associations in Africa (UAPS), North America (PAA), South America (ALAP) and Europe (EAPS)
